The first visualization shows how the iReady scores project students NYS achievement on the 3-8 spring assessments. The bar chart on the right divides the scores into percentiles, and the shows students who are at, above, or below grade level.

Clicking on a colored element on any of the three charts will produce a list of students matching the criterion selected and report key data points for each student. For example, to see all students who are projected to score at Level 3 on the State assessment, go to the first bar chart and click on the light green bar and an alphabetical list of students will be provided showing the each student s iReady scale score, national percentile, and grade equivalent.
